



Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSA)

GSAs have powers to impose fees and regulate groundwater extractions.

Groundwater Sustainability Agencies (GSA)


- Formed by counties, special districts, and mutual water companies via JPA, MOU, or other agreements.
- b) If other than a county, GSA can only encompass the service areas of member local agencies within a basin or subbasin.
- c) Must be established by June 30, 2017 for medium and high priority basins.
- d) State backstop starts July 1, 2017, if GSA not formed.

Critically Overdrafted subbasins must adopt a GS Plan by 1/31/2020; all others by 1/31/2022

— North Central and South Central Regions





GSA Formation


Overlapping boundaries & competing interests complicate GSA formation & governance in East San Joaquin and other subbasins.

Governance Options

MOA for multi-agency GSA, JPA for GSP preparation, implementation and enforcement, umbrella "Activity Agreement" for preparation of a single basin-wide GSP.

DWR awarded nearly \$7 million to aid counties



Groundwater Sustainability Plans (GSP)

- SGMA specifies GSP to be based on subbasin water balances (inflow-outflow).
- b) Evaluated by DWR; if GSP inadequate or not adopted by deadline, SWRCB can impose interim GSP.
- c) GSPs for Critically Overdrafted Subbasins must be adopted by 1/31/2020; all others by 1/31/2022.
- d) All GSPs within same subbasin must be coordinated by written agreement.

Potential Corrective Actions in Critically Overdrafted Basins

- a) Restrictions on Drilling of New Wells
- b) **Groundwater Replenishment Projects** e.g. stormwater capture projects
- c) **GSA-imposed Pumping Limits**according to hierarchy of groundwater rights
 already established for adjudicated basins

INSTRUCTIONS FOR FILING FIRST NOTICE GROUND WATER EXTRACTION

A SEPARATE FIRST NOTICE FOR EACH WELL should be typewritten or legibly written in ink. Where supplemental sheets are used, please make reference to the item number involved. Instructions for completing different ITEMS in the First Notice are as follows:

- The person (or firm) in whose name the notice is to be recorded should be stated here. Please use the same name for all wells.
- 2. Names of persons not included in Item 1 who are known to be using the well or claim an interest in water extracted there from should be listed in this item or on a supplemental sheet. It is not necessary to include names of persons if the extractor is a mutual water company, public utility or public agency.

CONDOR EARTH Summary

- a) SGMA implementation requires local initiative in a complex political landscape.
- b) GSAs will have power to collect fees and restrict pumping to enforce sustainable groundwater management.
- c) State will take over if planning is inadequate or deadlines are not achieved.
- d) Existing groundwater users will face challenges to justify use and avoid curtailment in critically overdrafted basins.

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
